


# Windows Mobile Smart Start

## Setting up E-Mail for Windows Mobile 6


Windows Mobile® lets you set up an e-mail account and start sending and receiving messages in a few easy steps.

### Setting up Gmail, Yahoo!, AOL, and Other POP3 and IMAP4 E-Mail


The E-mail Setup Wizard makes it easy to setup as many as six different e-mail accounts. We are using Windows Mobile 6 Standard in this how-to guide, but the process is nearly identical for Windows Mobile Professional.



**1** To start setting up an e-mail account, go to the **Start** menu and open **Messaging**. Click **New E-Mail Account** to open E-Mail Setup.



**2** Enter the e-mail address and password for the account. Be sure **Try to get e-mail settings automatically from the Internet** is selected.




**3** Auto Setup automatically finds the server settings for popular e-mail accounts, such as Yahoo!®, Gmail™, and AOL®.

*Tip:* You may need to enter the server settings manually for work e-mail or less common e-mail accounts.




**4** Enter your name as you would like it to appear on outgoing messages.

*Tip:* You can also change the account display name on this screen.



**5** Your user name is already entered. Enter your password and click **Next**.

*Tip:* Select **Save password** to avoid entering it each time you access the account.



**6** Click **Automatic Send/Receive** to change how often the phone checks for new messages. Click **Review all download settings** to make other changes, such as downloading partial rather than full messages. Click **Finish** to start downloading messages.


## Setting up Windows Live Hotmail

You can get Direct Push e-mail with Windows Live Hotmail. If you don't have Windows Live on your Windows Mobile phone you can go to <http://wl.windowsmobile.com> and download it to your phone for free!




**1** Open the **Start** menu and click **Windows Live**.

**Tip:** If you use the E-Mail Setup Wizard it will automatically send you to the Windows Live Hotmail e-mail setup.



**2** You'll need to click to sign in to Windows Live and then enter the Hotmail e-mail address and password



**3** You'll see a few screens with choices on how you want to use Windows Live, such as managing your Windows Live contacts. Click **Next** on this screen to begin downloading messages.


## Setting Up Microsoft Exchange Server E-Mail

You can get Direct Push e-mail with Exchange. Someone in IT will often set up Exchange e-mail for you on your Windows Mobile phone for work. If you do it yourself you'll need to contact the Exchange administrator for the server information and other settings for the account.




**1** Start by opening **ActiveSync** and clicking the hyperlink.

**Tip:** You can use either the E-Mail Setup Wizard or ActiveSync to set up Exchange e-mail on a Windows Mobile 6 phone.




**2** Enter the e-mail address for the Exchange account.




**3** Enter the server address for the account. This is the server address you use for Outlook® Web Access.


**Tip:** Ask IT if the server requires an encrypted connection.



**4** Your user name will already be entered. Enter the password and domain.



**5** Exchange can wirelessly synchronize Contacts, Calendar, and Tasks, as well as Direct Push e-mail.



**6** Highlight **E-mail** and then click **Menu > Settings** to limit the size of downloads, change the message format, and more.
